After catering to elementary and middle schools, Picaboo Yearbooks, by now an independent company, acquired Vidigami in 2017 so that we could offer more services to a wider student population. Vidigami offers schools a private social network for sharing photos, videos and school experiences. It also provides robust, easy to use media management which makes the yearbook experience multi-dimensional.

We continue to grow, year after year, both within our sales and service teams, and with expansion of our brands and products. In 2020 we changed our corporate name to A Milestone Group (Milestone) and we continue to operate our family of brands, Picaboo Yearbooks, Milestone Yearbooks, TheYearbookFiles.com and Vidigami, under the new name. Developing a Yearbook Theme

A yearbook’s theme helps tell the story of the year, unifies the book and gives it a plan. The theme should be unique to the specific school in that particular year. Here are some ideas on how to get started with choosing your yearbook’s theme.

 **VERBAL**

A verbal theme uses a catch phrase to introduce the yearbook’s personality. Carefully chosen verbal themes will provide a number of opportunities for spin-offs and further development. Great themes will lead to both direct spin-offs and indirect spin-offs.

Research idioms, rhyming and thesaurus dictionaries as you brainstorm theme and headline ideas.

 **VISUAL**

A visual theme uses design elements to introduce the yearbook’s personality. These elements include type, color, graphics and photo styles. Smart designers realize that the visuals they choose should be subtle and simple and avoid ‘decorating’ the page.

Folios, or page numbers, are one great area to develop your theme.

Only use graphics with purpose and meaning. Avoid using graphics that are overused.

MORE TIPS:

- Don’t use copyrighted materials. The legal concerns usually aren’t worth the trouble.
- While you don’t want to overdo the theme, try to represent it on each page with folios, spot color or font.
- Don’t only have your theme on your cover. Carry your theme throughout the book.

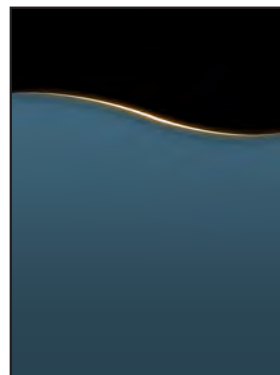
Keyword: “illuminate”

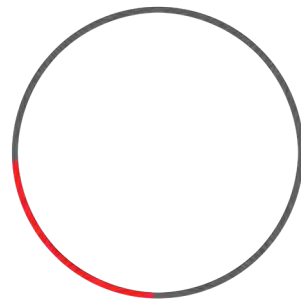
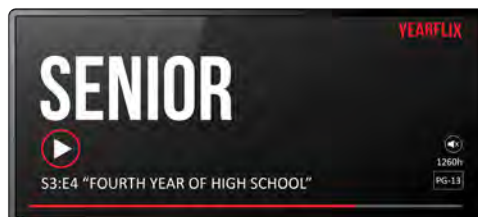
The “Yearflix” theme was created to be a fun exploration of something each and every student can associate with – streaming movies and hit TV shows to their electronic devices.

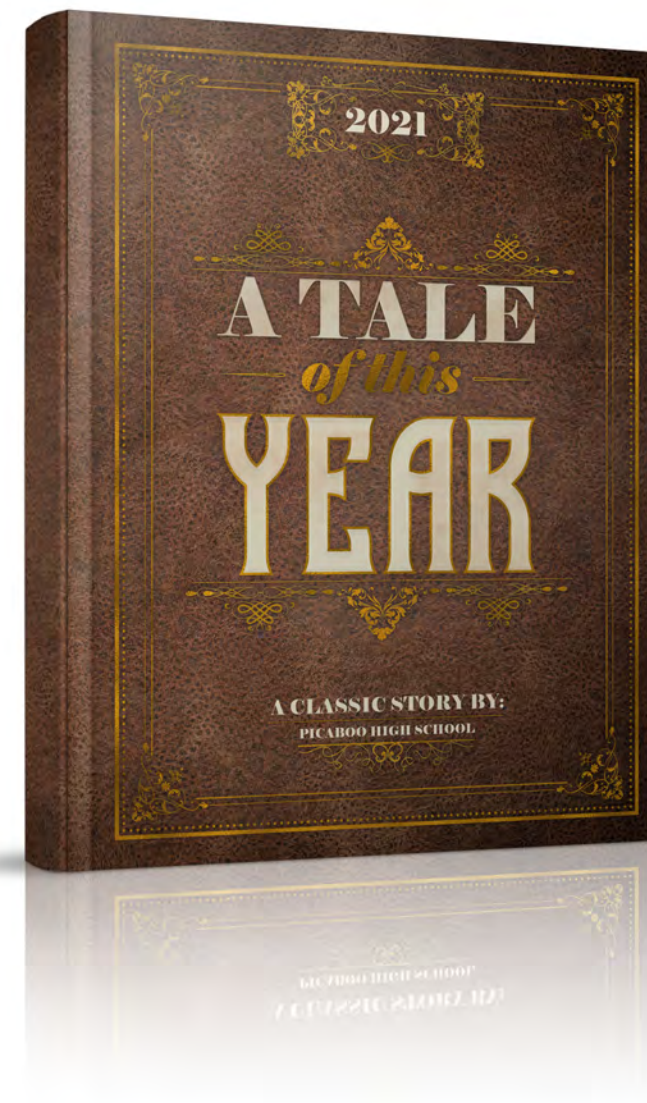

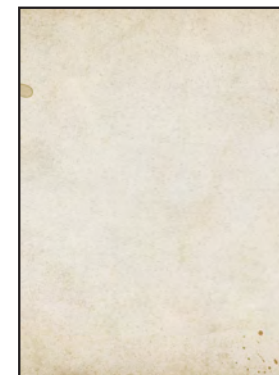

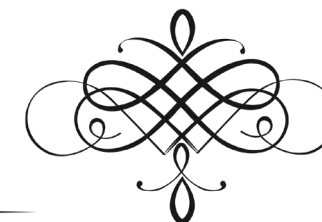

This theme, with its colorful art and backgrounds, celebrates the diversity and uniqueness of your school and places a beautiful piece of art in the students' hands!

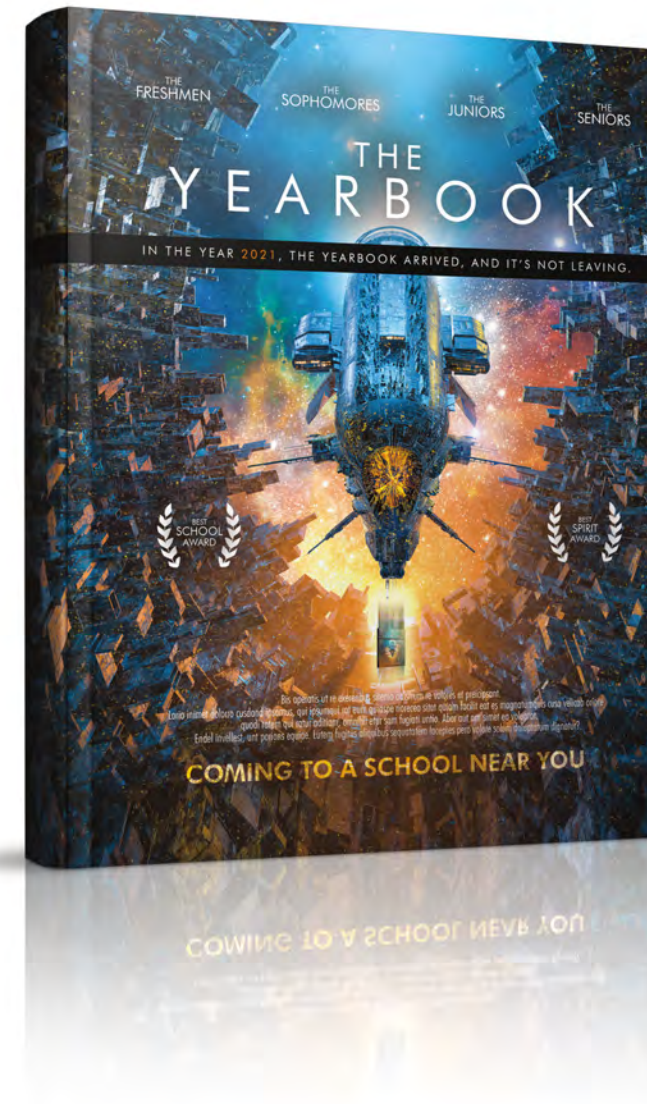
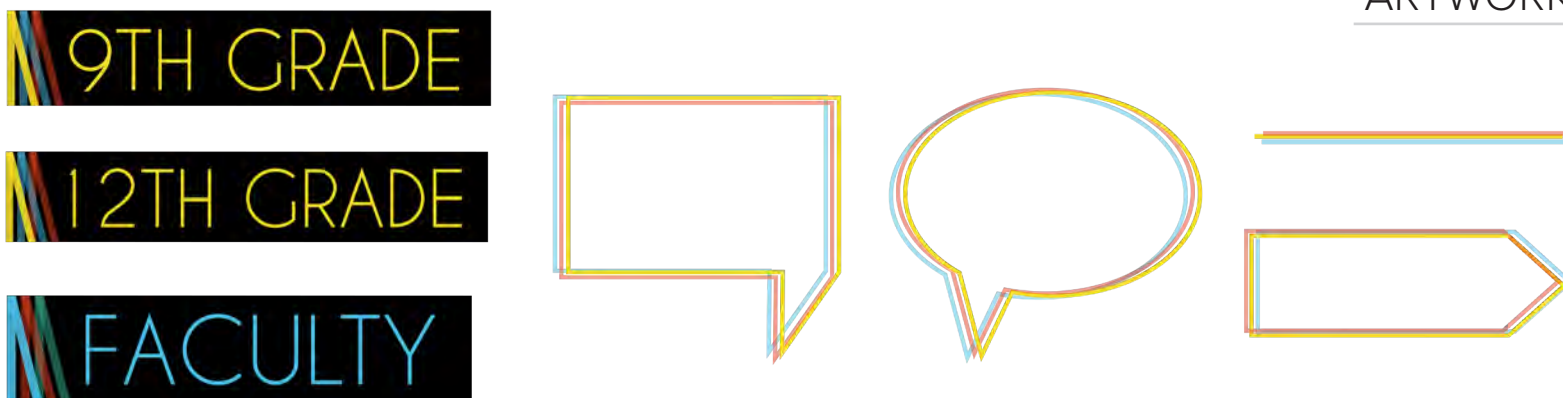

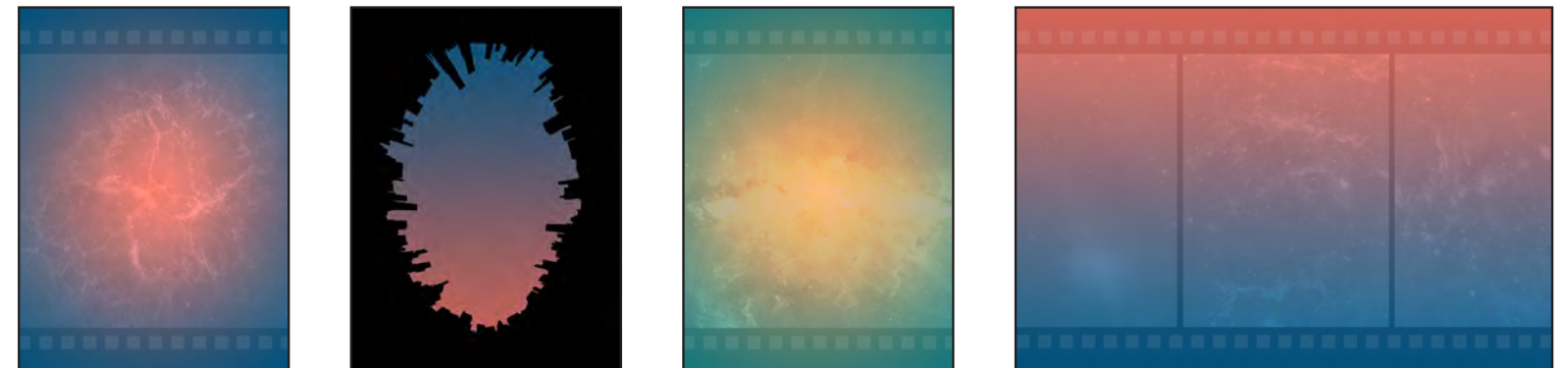

The anticipation of coming back together and having a normal school year is palpable, and this theme gives it the red carpet treatment!

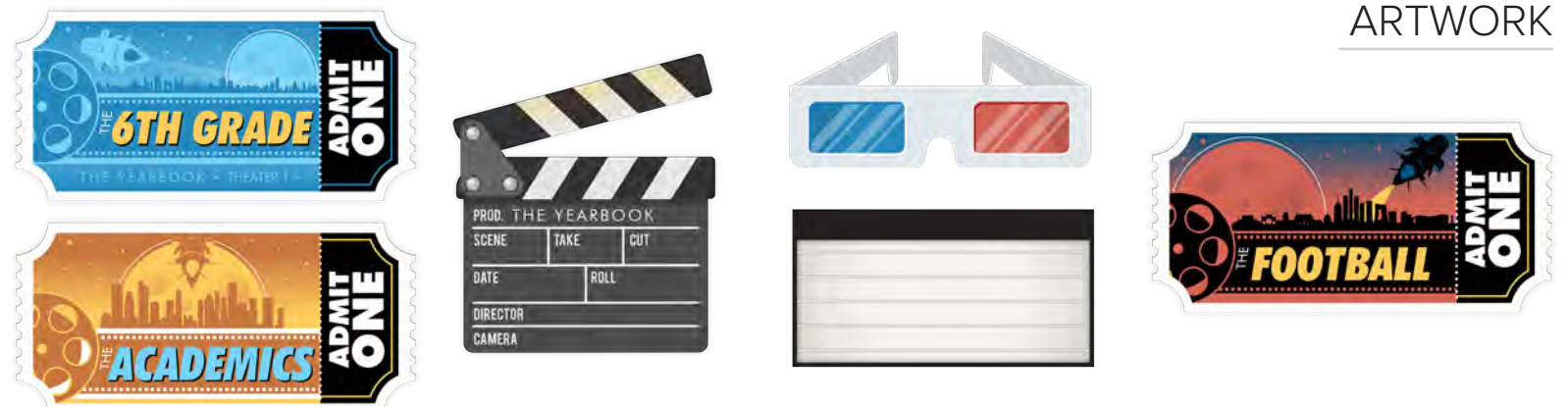

Keyword: "tunedin"

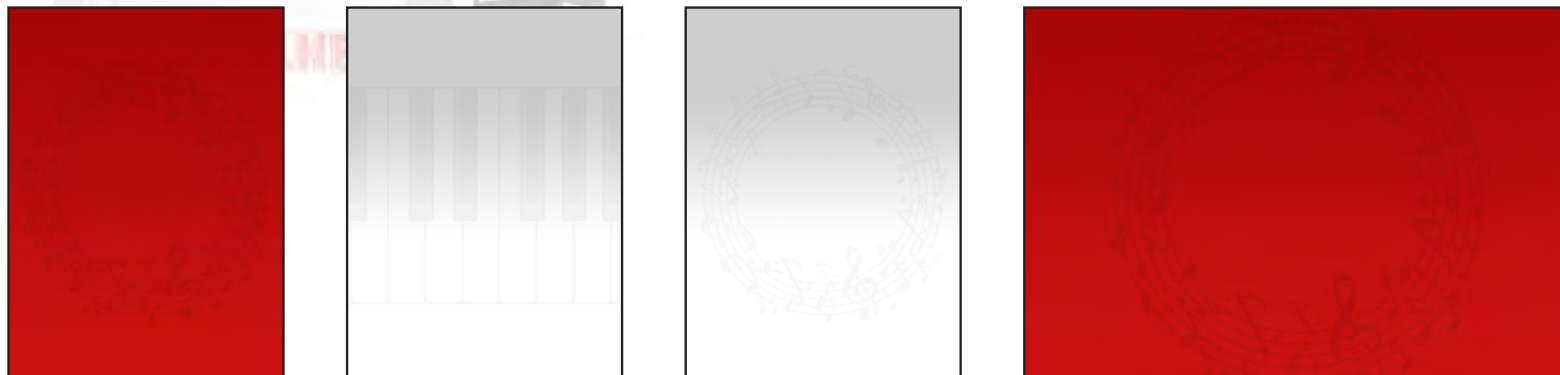

Summer Olympics Report

Although the 2020 Tokyo Summer Olympics were postponed until summer 2021, the delay didn't dampen the intense competition and energy brought forth by fans and athletes from around the globe.

Opening Ceremonies

This year's Olympic Games Opening Ceremony, titled "United by Emotion," included a moment of silence in remembrance of loved ones who were lost to the pandemic. Despite the shadow cast by the one-year postponement of the Olympic Games and a ban on spectators, athletes showed up full of excitement and ready to represent their countries. The Olympic flame was lit at the conclusion of the ceremony, signifying the start of the games.

USA Gymnastics

Simone Biles: Coming into Tokyo 2020, everyone waited and held their breath to see what gymnastics star Simone Biles might achieve at her second Olympic Games. Biles, 24, announced that she would not be taking part in the team final to focus on her mental health after she developed the "twisties," and lost herself in the air during the vault in the team final. Removing herself from the competition shocked the world, but Biles continued with bravery and grace, demonstrating all the qualities of a top teammate. She became her team's loudest supporter and cheerleader as they went on to capture the silver medal behind the Russian Olympic Committee. Biles went through a physical and mental assessment before returning to take the bronze in the balance beam final.

Suni Lee: Olympic newcomer Suni Lee had an impressive run at the 2020 Olympic Games. The 18-year-old Minnesota native took home the gold medal in the women's all-around competition, as well as a silver in the women's team final and bronze in the individual uneven bars. Lee captured the spotlight following Simone Biles' withdrawal from the team final. She embraced the moment and made a name for herself as one of USA Gymnastics' newest all-stars.

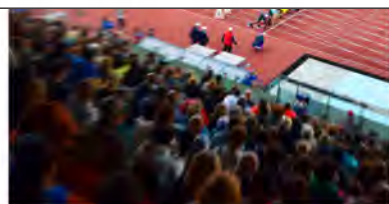

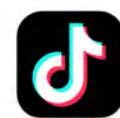

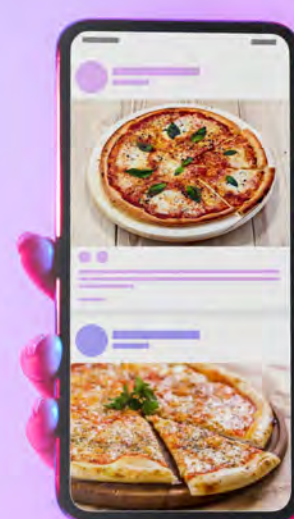

THE BUZZ 2020-2021



NBA FINALS

The NBA suspended regular season play on March 11, 2020 and returned to play with seeding games for the playoffs. The playoff series began Sept. 30, 2020 which was the latest start ever, and lasted six games between the Miami Heat and the Los Angeles Lakers. The Lakers won the series four games to two and LeBron James was named MVP for the fourth time in his career.



STANLEY CUP

The regular season of the NHL was suspended on March 12, 2020 when the world went into lockdown. On Aug. 1, playoffs began with teams earning spots based on their March standings. The Tampa Bay Lightning and the Dallas Stars competed for the Stanley Cup with the Lightning reigning victorious, four games to two. All six games were played in Edmonton, Canada with no fans in attendance.



WORLD SERIES

In October 2020, the L.A. Dodgers beat the Tampa Bay Rays four games to two in the MLB World Series, concluding a short 60 game season which had to be played in a single field. So for the first time since 1944, all games were played on a single field - this time at the new Globe Life Field in Arlington, TX. Fans attended in person at 25% capacity. And the first found creative ways to stay connected to the action, watching the games on giant screens in stadium parking lots, from their cars.

MONUMENTAL EVENTS

NEW SUPREME COURT JUSTICE

On October 26, 2020, the US Senate voted 52-48 to confirm Judge Amy Coney Barrett as the 11th Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court. Justice Barrett is the fifth woman to sit on the bench, and is also the youngest justice ever. She received her law degree at Notre Dame and clerked for U.S. Supreme Court Justice Antonin Scalia. She returned to Notre Dame as a law professor before being appointed to the Seventh Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals where she served until being confirmed to the Supreme Court.

COVID VACCINE ROLLOUT

The first Covid vaccine, manufactured by Pfizer/BioNTech, was authorized for emergency use (EUA) by the US FDA on December 31, 2020 and was followed closely by approval for the Moderna vaccine. The rollout of vaccination had a slow start with only 2.8 million people vaccinated in the US by the end of 2020. By February 2021, that number had risen to 48 million and President Biden announced that 200 million doses had been purchased, and would be available to all eligible adults by spring 2021.

WORLD SERIES

The Washington Nationals beat the Houston Astros 6-2 in Game 7 of the World Series in Houston. It is the Nationals' first championship since the franchise moved to Washington, DC in 2005. The Nationals are also the first team in MLB history to win the World Series by winning 4 games at the visiting team.

LEAGUE OF LEGENDS

The 9th League of Legends Worlds hosted 60 events in 36 countries and 5 continents. More than 21.8 million people watched over 1 billion hours of content! After 99 of the 140 eligible players battled, FunPlus Phoenix were crowned World Champions.

WORLD CUP

Nearly 16 million people tuned in to watch the US Women's National Soccer Team defeat the Netherlands 2-0. The final game of the 2019 World Cup, held in Lyon, France, gave the US Women their 4th consecutive World Cup win. And, on the way to winning, the team broke the previous record of goals scored in a single World Cup, held by Germany!

SPACE WALK

NASA astronauts Christina Koch and Jessica Meir made history on October 18 when they completed the first all-female spacewalk. The pair spent 7 hours and 17 minutes on their walk (and took a call from the president while walking)! Both have spent months on the International Space Station, but Koch holds the record for the most time in space for a woman, at 323 days.

Coronaviruses are a large family of viruses common to animals and humans, and are not new. COVID-19 is a novel, meaning new, type of Coronavirus. In COVID-19, 'COV' stands for 'corona', 'VI' for 'virus', and '19' for 'disease' and '19' is for 2019. It was initially found in Italy, and later transmitted to people in China in late 2019. 



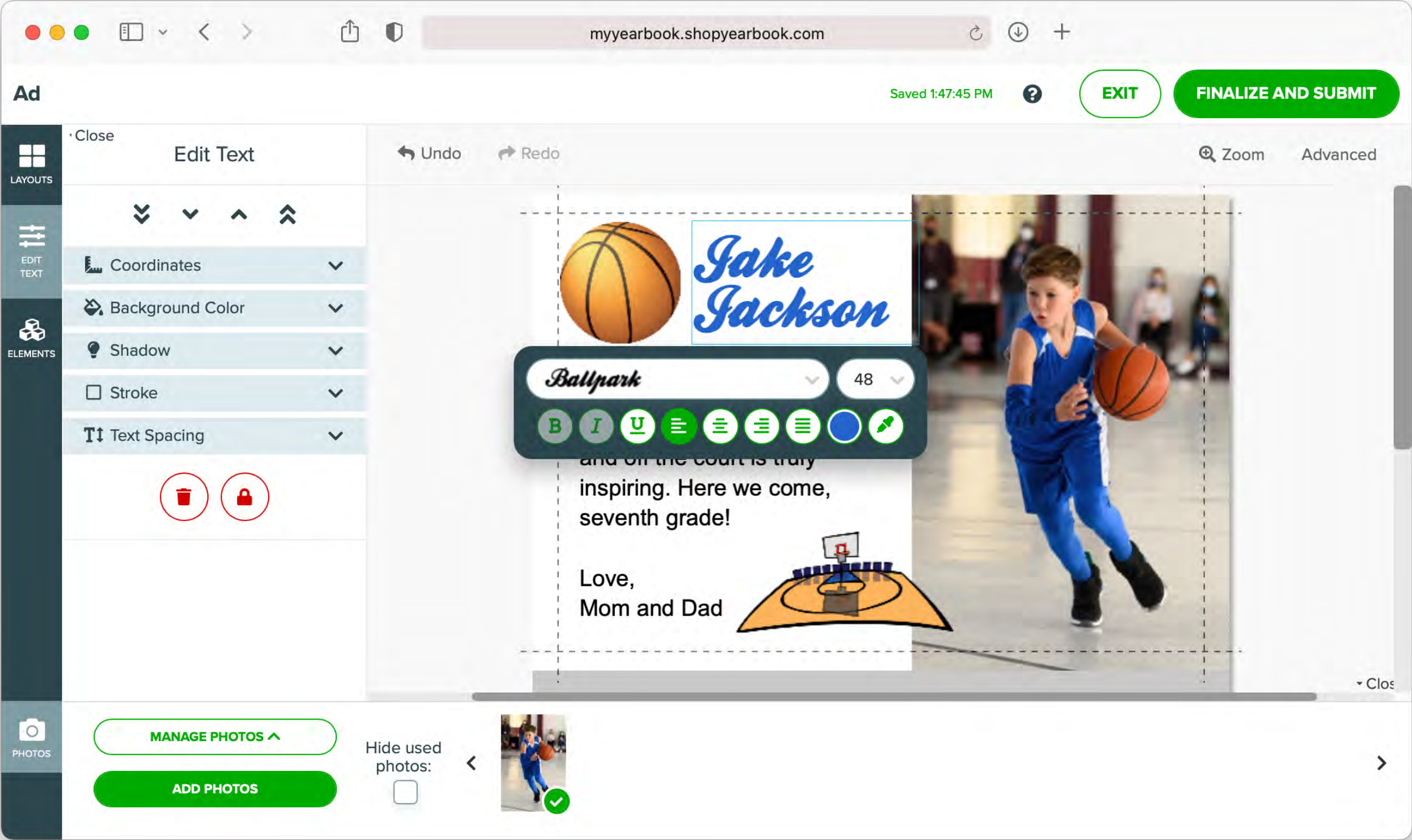
